The YELLOW and GREEN teams have both taken out the weekly prize in the last two weeks. Congratulations! At this stage, it is looking like YELLOW might be champions again this week. I can't wait to see!

It was great to see everyone 'Opening the Doors to Mercy' during Catholic Education Week and looking for acts of kindness they could perform randomly. Well done class, I hope this continues.

Mr Brad has the RESQ Roos program in full swing where the children have been treating injuries, bandaging each other up and revising effective fire drill procedures-I think we have definitely got the 'STOP, DROP and ROLL' sequence down pat!

In Literacy we have been exploring the effects of imagery and how it helps to Create a vivid mental image. I wonder who Can tell their parents what 'Create a vivid mental image' means? We have also been working to read with a natural rhythm and use subordinating Conjunctions to write Complex sentences.
