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Welcome to week 4. It has been another busy week in Year 5/6!

We are really concentrating on "active learning" in class at the moment. The push behind this is not just for the children to be passive observers during the lesson, but rather becoming an active participant. Doing this requires a much higher level of concertation and can be tiring but I must say the students are making good gains in this area and I trust this will be reflected in their upcoming assessments.

Speaking of assessments. We do have NAPLAN coming up for our year 5 students. We will be doing some preparation for this by working on some NAPLAN type questions in class. This is simply to ensure the students are familiar with the format of the tests they will soon be undertaking however we are not going to let it dominate our thinking.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone for getting their pictures and fishing reports in. Now comes the hard part of putting it all together but we can only try and see if we can create an article which will be published.

I also need to congratulate Jack, Karla, Ethan and Amelia for being part of our Tagai Challenge team. I hope I will be able to give you some more feedback on how this goes in the near future.

I thought this might also be an appropriate time to update you with our theme for this term and what we will be looking at in each subject area. This term the title of our unit is "Everything Matters" and this is based around our work in science which is on types and states of matter.

Religion

Our focus in RE for this term is the Mary. We are learning about her life and times and why she holds such a special place in the Catholic faith.

English

English has focused on narratives since the start of term. We have looked at different narrators and how their point of view influences the story. We are also working hard on our editing skills and this is another area where our hard work is starting to pay off.

Maths

There has been some outstanding work happening during maths lessons this term. Our knowledge of the order of operations continues to grow, and we are learning some very basic algebra. I am continually impressed by how rapidly the children are grasping these new concepts.

Science

As well as matter, the students are learning how to plan, write, conduct and report on simple experiments.

History

In history, we are looking at colonial Australia, including the effects of the gold rush.

Technology

In technology we are learning to program computers using Java. Something tells me this may be a slow journey but the children are starting to come to grips with this language and how accurately they have to type in order to make it work correctly.

HPE

As cross country is over for now, we are trying to get some team building happening during Health and Physical Education, by playing some team games.

Skoolbag

Skoolbag is one of the ways the school communicates with families. It allows the school to send through push notifications or emails (to subscribers) with urgent information or just reminders to school events. The newsletters are also available on Skoolbag.

Another benefit of Skoolbag is that you can notify the school of your child's absence via eForms.

It is a free app available on smartphones or tablets.

Skoolbag information can also be viewed through our OLSH webpage at www.olsh.qld.edu.au.

Instructions on how to install Skoolbag onto your device are on page 10 of this newsletter.



How To Install Skoolbag On Your Smartphone

For iPhone and iPad users:

- 1. Click the "App Store" icon on your Apple device.
- 2. Type your school name in the search, using suburb name will help.
- 3. You will see your school appear, click "Get" then "install".
- 4. The app is FREE to download.
- 5. When installed click "Open"
- 6. Select "OK" to receive push notifications, when asked.
- 7. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup".
- 8. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you by tapping the on/off switch.

For Android users:

You must first have signed up with a Google Account before installing the app.

- 1. Click the "Play Store" button on your Android Device
- 2. Click the magnifying glass icon at the top and type in your school name, using suburb name will help.
- 3. Click the school name when it appears in the search.
- 4. Click the "Install" button.
- 5. Click "Accept" for various permissions (please note, we do not modify any of your personal data on your device).
- 6. Click "Open" when installed.
- 7. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup".
- 8. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you by tapping the on/off switch.

Please Note: Some brands of Android phones need the setting in "Notification Manager" changed to "Allow" instead of "Notify" in order for the push notifications to work. The phone must also be running at least version 4 system software to run the app.

For Windows 81 Phone and Windows 81 or 10 device users:

- 1. Go to the Windows Store on your 81 Windows Phone or Windows 81/10 Device
- 2. Search for "Skoolbag" in the keyword app search
- 3. Install the Skoolbag app
- 4. Find your school either by using the keyword search or location service.
- 5. Click the "Pin" icon to pin the school tile to your Windows Phone home screen.
- 6. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup"
- 7. Toggle the Push Categories that are applicable to you by tapping the on/off switch.
